

Are you ready for victory?

We've seen those teams before. They have great talent, often all-Americans and potential NBA stars. They play tough in games and their games are usually close ones. However, they just can't seem to win on a regular basis. When the clock is running out, they commit the crucial turnover, miss the essential free throw or make an epic mental mistake.

You will often hear commentators say of these types of teams, "They just don't know how to win." The team needs to elevate their game to the next level and take the next step, but something gets in the way. It would seem all the pieces are there for a contender, but the puzzle never gets finished.

What barrier exists that causes some teams to fold at key moments? Is it a lack of teamwork? Poor coaching? Perhaps the inability to handle the stress of clutch situations? Whatever happens, they just can't seem to seal the deal and until they overcome their hang-ups, they will continue to come close, but ultimately fail. Victory eludes them.

As we approach Resurrection Sunday, we will be studying 1 Corinthians 15 and learning about victory. Christ's victory over the grave. Our victory over sin and death because of Christ's sacrifice. Our eternal state as we rejoice in victory forever! We don't want to be one who comes close, but can't overcome in the end. We want to win! We want to celebrate victory!

There are some who question the existence of God, but are especially skeptical about the bodily resurrection of Christ. February 24 we will be talking about the Evidence of Victory from 1 Cor. 15:1-11.

For those who really don't think the resurrection makes a big difference in our faith, we will look at 1 Cor. 15:12-19 on March 3 as we talk about the Importance of Victory.

On March 10 we get into the nuts and bolts of how it all works as we dissect the mystery of resurrection by talking about the Order of Victory, 1 Cor. 15:20-28.

We get a vision of how our victory should cause us to view our earthly existence in 1 Cor. 15:29-34 as we look at the Incentive of Victory (March 17).

What will victory be like when we realize it in its fullness? Simply put, what will my victory body be like? Read 1 Cor. 15:35-49 to see what God's word says about that when we study the Embodiment of Victory on the 24th.

And resurrection Sunday is March 31. We finish the chapter (1 Cor. 15:50-58) with the simple message entitled Victory!

Why this emphasis on victory in Christ? That is what resurrection is all about. We live in a messed up world. Sometimes we get scared. Scared of the future, scared of the past, scared of the present. Some people live in fear because they don't realize the victory we have in Christ. Our victory does not depend upon our power but is rooted in the power of Christ. Victory conquers fear.

Some people have no joy. They are depressed, dejected, rejected and hopeless. Resurrection reminds us that someone loves us enough to die for us...and He also loves us enough that he rose from the dead and He lives for us. Victory is a message of love, hope and peace.

Just look at our world. It is broken. Victory reminds us of a future where there is no sin, sorrow or pain. It is a message of joy.

Then there are some people who are close, but they need to elevate to the next level, step up their game, [or insert your favorite sports cliché here]. They read the bible. They are seeking. They believe, but they still need to believe. They need to take the next step but something is holding them back. Maybe fear; maybe they just don't see the urgency. Nevertheless, they need to submit to the command of God and to His holy word and be immersed into Christ.

Just as Christ was crucified and buried, they need to be buried in the waters of baptism. Just as Christ arose from the dead and defeated death, they need to identify with Christ as they rise up from the watery grave of baptism to new life. **Galatians 3:27** *For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ.* There is absolutely nothing in our faith that represents our victory more than our baptism. Our obedience to Him in our faith and in our baptism allows us to put on Christ and live in victory as we walk the earth as well as anticipate the assurance of our victory to come for all eternity.

Are you ready to win? Victory is ours in Christ!

Recipe Swap

CHEESEBURGER SOUP

½ lb. ground beef (brown and set aside)

Saute the following 6 ingredients in 1T.of butter until vegetables are tender.

¾ c. chopped onion

¾ c. shredded carrots

¾ c. diced celery

1 tsp. oregano

1 tsp. dried basil

1 tsp. dried parsley flakes

Combine the following 2 ingredients.

3 c. chicken broth

4 c. peeled and diced potatoes

Add the browned beef, broth and potatoes to the sautéed vegetables. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer until potatoes are tender.

Melt 3 T. butter in a small skillet, add flour and cook until bubbly. Add to the soup mixture, stir and bring to a boil. Cook and stir 2 minutes. Reduce heat to low. Add the following ingredients.

8 oz. velveeta cheese (cubed)

1½ c. milk

¾ tsp. salt

¼ to ½ tsp. pepper

Cook and stir until cheese melts. Remove from heat and stir in ¼ c. sour cream.

Blend well and serve.

MEN'S BREAKFAST: The men's breakfast will be on Mar. 9th at 8:00 AM. Mike Kirby will be cooking.


TIME CHANGE: Time change will be Mar. 10th. Don't forget to set your clocks ahead one hour.

MINISTRY/ACTIVITY FOLDERS

The following folders will be placed on the table in the foyer beginning Feb. 3rd.

Activity Folders:

We are revamping the “ministry folders” and they have become “Activity Folders”. Following is an explanation of each folder. Each folder includes what has been done in the past, but new ideas are welcomed.

Fellowship—this can go on all year. This folder needs a home with someone who would be interested in planning activities to include all family members. Activities might include movie nights, game nights, a pizza night, a bowling night, putt putt golf, etc. Anything a family could do together would be included.

Sonrise Breakfast—this is held Easter morning. The chairperson would be responsible for coordinating the times with Mike. They would be in charge of getting men volunteers to cook and donations for food items.

Mother’s Day—responsible for planning the recognition of moms-usually during church.

Graduate Banquet—responsible for setting a time, place, sending out invitations, decorating and planning a little ceremony.

Father’s Day—responsible for planning the recognition of dads-usually during church.

Vacation Bible School—This person would be the director who would decide on a program, organize committees, decide on dates and prepare a schedule. VBS dates need to be approved by the board. May have this year’s VBS program taken care of but would still need a coordinator.

RETURN SERVICE REQUESTED

Thanksgiving Dinner & Soup Supper—you would be in charge of getting enough food for the church dinner, generally held the Sunday before Thanksgiving. Also being prepared with decorations and dishes and other supplies. A “take out” meal is generally provided to our shut in members before we eat. The soup supper is held in January on a rotation with the other churches in the community. We generally serve soups, relishes, desserts, etc.

Church Christmas Dinner—This person plans where the group would be eating and making the reservations if needed. Usually held the regular meeting date of Dec. board meeting (second Wed.) Have also done as a “progressive dinner” so other options are available.

Caroling—you would be in charge of setting the date and organizing times, rides, and snacks afterwards.

Christmas Program—Responsible for deciding on the program, organizing those involved with practices, and preparing scenery if needed. Usually held at 10:00 AM the Sunday before Christmas. There are plenty of programs in the office to review and use if desired.

If you chair and activity be sure and sign the master list on the table.

We are not limited to these activities and would welcome new ways to glorify God.

There are lots of persons who are willing to help the chairperson with the activities.
