I still like video games. When I got my first computer with Windows 95, it came with solitaire and Myst. Ever since, it seems every computing electronic device comes standard with 'time wasters' that can actually become quite addicting.

Today we have Nintendo, X-box and Playstation. We have phones and tablets that give us the ability to download literally thousands of games. Which brings me to the latest craze (this is embarrassing, but an addict cannot help himself, right?). Candy Crush.

Candy Crush was designed with the addict in mind. After five unsuccessful attempts to clear the board, you have to wait to accumulate more 'lives.' Or...you can beg friends to give them to you – like a junkie, or buy them like a high class addict! The point is, you can spend an inordinate amount of time playing games. I am not saying to give up enjoyment or entertainment. I am not telling anyone to relinquish your Candy Crush (or whatever your pleasure is)!! However, with all things, we need moderation – and I include this old video game addict with everyone else. My toes hurt too!

The apostle Paul wrote, "*All things are lawful for me,*" *but not all things are helpful.* "*All things are lawful for me,*" *but I will not be dominated by anything.* **1 Corinthians 6:12**

Peter wrote, "... *For whatever overcomes a person, to that he is enslaved.*" **2 Peter 2:19**

We are called to be slaves to Christ and Christ alone. Even the innocent and the mundane can enslave us if we have no self-control and do not put Christ and only Christ upon the throne of our hearts. It really comes down to how you use your time.

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. **Ephesians 5:15-17**

Recipe Swap

MEXICAN CHICKEN MANICOTTI

8 oz. manicotti shells
2c. cubed cooked chicken
8oz. shredded Monterey Jack cheese,
divided
6oz. shredded cheddar cheese
8oz. sour cream
1 small onion, diced, divided
4oz. chopped green chilies, divided
1 can condensed cream of chicken soup,
undiluted
1c. salsa
2/3 c. milk

Cook manicotti according to package directions. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, combine the chicken, 1-1/2 c. Monterey Jack cheese, cheddar cheese, sour cream, half of the onion, and 6 T. chilies. In another bowl, combine the soup, salsa, milk and remaining onion and chilies. Spread 1/2 c. in a greased 13x9x2 in. baking dish. Drain manicotti; stuff each with about 1/4 c. chicken mixture. Arrange over sauce in baking dish. Pour remaining sauce over shells. Cover and bake at 350* for 30 minutes. Uncover; sprinkle with remaining Monterey Jack cheese. Bake 10 minutes longer or until cheese is melted.

MINISTRY/ACTIVITY FOLDERS

The following folders will be placed on the table in the foyer.

Activity Folders:

We are revamping the “ministry folders” and they have become “Activity Folders”. Following is an explanation of each folder. Each folder includes what has been done in the past, but new ideas are welcomed.

Fellowship—this can go on all year. This folder needs a home with someone who would be interested in planning activities to include all family members. Activities might include movie nights, game nights, a pizza night, a bowling night, putt putt golf, etc. Anything a family could do together would be included.

Sonrise Breakfast—this is held Easter morning. The chairperson would be responsible for coordinating the times with Mike. They would be in charge of getting men volunteers to cook and donations for food items.

Mother’s Day—responsible for planning the recognition of moms-usually during church.

Graduate Banquet—responsible for setting a time, place, sending out invitations, decorating and planning a little ceremony.

Father’s Day—responsible for planning the recognition of dads-usually during church.

Vacation Bible School—This person would be the director who would decide on a program, organize committees, decide on dates and prepare a schedule. VBS dates need to be approved by the board. May have this year’s VBS program taken care of but would still need a coordinator.

RETURN SERVICE REQUESTED

Thanksgiving Dinner & Soup Supper—you would be in charge of getting enough food for the church dinner, generally held the Sunday before Thanksgiving. Also being prepared with decorations and dishes and other supplies. A “take out” meal is generally provided to our shut in members before we eat. The soup supper is held in January on a rotation with the other churches in the community. We generally serve soups, relishes, desserts, etc.

Church Christmas Dinner—This person plans where the group would be eating and making the reservations if needed. Usually held the regular meeting date of Dec. board meeting (second Wed.) Have also done as a “progressive dinner” so other options are available.

Caroling—you would be in charge of setting the date and organizing times, rides, and snacks afterwards.

Christmas Program—Responsible for deciding on the program, organizing those involved with practices, and preparing scenery if needed. Usually held at 10:00 AM the Sunday before Christmas. There are plenty of programs in the office to review and use if desired.

If you chair and activity be sure and sign the master list on the table.

We are not limited to these activities and would welcome new ways to glorify God.

There are lots of persons who are willing to help the chairperson with the activities.
