CHINA EGGS

When I was in sales we were warned against counting on prospects that really were not prospects at all. They looked like a prospect, talked like a prospect and acted like a prospect. But in reality they had no intentions of purchasing our product. We called them "China eggs".

A China egg looks just like a real egg, all nice and shiny, but it will never hatch because it is made out of porcelain. God spoke of this same idea through Jeremiah in Jer. 17:11. "As a partridge that broods (lit. sits on eggs) but does not hatch, so is he who gets riches, but not by right; It will leave him in the midst of his days, and at his end he will be a fool."

Don't we sometimes put our hope in the wrong place or in the wrong person? It may be that we fail to "move on" to the next lost soul in sharing the gospel. The scriptures point us to times when our efforts would be better spent somewhere else. When the Jews in Corinth opposed Paul's teaching about Jesus being the Christ "he shook his garments and said to them, "Your blood be upon your own heads; I am clean. From now on I go to the Gentiles." (Acts 18:6) Sadly, there are some who look like brethren but prove themselves to be those we should avoid. "Now I urge you, brethren, note those who cause divisions and offenses, contrary to the doctrine which you learned, and avoid them." (Rom. 16:17)

Going back to our verse from Jeremiah, sometimes we put our trust in the wrong place. We think we have something but in reality, it will never "hatch". The person who "gets ahead" at any price will find that he has put his treasure in the wrong place. At the end of his life he will find that his "eggs" never hatched. "But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be, which thou hast provided? So is he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God" (Lk 12:20-21).

Perhaps the real lesson for us is this: "For we walk by faith and not by sight." (1 Thes. 5:17) Our greatest hope is that which we cannot even see with the naked eye. "...but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one still hope for what he sees?" (Rom. 8:24) But when we only trust in what we can see or if we put our efforts in that which will never produce anything, then we are sitting on China eggs which will never hatch!

The First Reality Show?

I have an idea for a new reality TV show. Take a family of say eight or ten people. Put them all in one large boat for a year. Everything they need to survive is on the boat. For a year, they can't dock anywhere. They have no radio communication with the outside world. There are no rescue teams to save them from imminent danger when a major storm blows in.

Then just let the cameras roll.

We could call it Survivor: Pacific Ocean.

Would it be a ratings sensation or a flop?

Oh, wait! It has already been done. Around 6000 years ago or so. You can read about it in Genesis 6-9.

OK, there were no cameras. And the audience didn't seem to care about crazy old Noah building this giant monstrosity of a boat. (I wonder what the Home Owners Association thought of that?)

They didn't care, that is, until it started to rain...and rain...and rain...and it wouldn't stop. They didn't care until the ground broke open and the great fountains of the deep burst forth to cover the earth with water. They didn't care until they had gone to the highest land point they could find and the water continued to rise.

By then, it was too late. Soon, there was only an audience of one. Or should I say, One. God. All that was left were the contestants. Noah, his wife, his three sons and their wives were the only ones on the boat, but God had His eye on them the whole time.

I love the account of Noah for many reasons. I believe the great flood is a much better explanation for what we see in the world today than millions and billions of years are. The Grand Canyon, the fossil record, and our weather patterns can all be understood from a biblical perspective through the account of Noah.

From the time they entered the ark and God shut them in until they stepped out on land again was 370 days. Over one year.

With the same people.

In a boat.

With stinky animals.

Noah and his family made it through that with Noah leading as the patriarch and depending on the Lord.

I love Noah because he was very close to God. **Genesis 6:9** *These are the generations of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation. Noah walked with God.* Noah also had a preacher's heart. God called Noah a preacher of righteousness. **2 Peter 2:5 (NIV)** *[God] did not spare the ancient world when he brought the flood on its ungodly people, but protected Noah, a preacher of righteousness, and seven others.*

It likely took 100 years or more to build an ark that was a football field and a half long out of hand cut and hand hewn wood. It had three levels and was 75 feet wide. Imagine as Noah was working on this creation ordained by God that people would stop by and ask, "Hey, Noah, what are you doing?" Noah would be able to respond about the wickedness of the world, the love and patience of God and the destruction and judgment to come. It probably didn't take long for Noah to become a laughingstock, yet he was faithful to God and continued to be a herald of righteousness. 100 years with zero converts. Many people would call that a failure.

Oh, that we could fail like Noah. That we could live righteous lives. That we would radically obey our Lord and Savior without worrying what the world thought of us. That we were able to wait patiently on the Lord as he delivered us through our storms and floods.

God gave us the rainbow as a sign for His covenant with us that he would never destroy the earth by water. Nevertheless, we still need some Noahs today.

We need people to preach righteousness because this world *'is corrupt in God's sight, and the earth [is] filled with violence (Genesis 6:11).'*

Recipe Swap

CORN DIP

3 cans Mexi- Corn, drained



MEN'S BREAKFAST: The men's breakfast will be on June 11th. Jay Welborn will be cooking.
