I wish I did understand everything. I wish I had the answer. I wish I could tell a young Christian couple why they are unable to conceive when there are thousands of abortions every year in the United States. Oh, I can speculate as to what God might have in mind. I wish I could tell them, without a doubt, exactly why they had to go through this.

I wish I could tell the widow why her husband suddenly died. I don't want to be able to give them the medical diagnosis - that is for the doctors. I wish I could tell her what God was thinking and has planned when He allowed it to happen.

I wish I could tell the distraught parents why their children strayed from the Jesus even though they did their best to raise them in the "fear and admonition of the Lord."

I can blame our sin nature, the curse, original sin, the enemy of our souls (Satan), and all the pat answers as to why this world is the way it is, but that doesn't tell anyone, "Why me? Why now?"

Part of being human is wanting to know there is a purpose behind our suffering. If we must endure, we want it to mean something, to be for a good cause.

Imagine how long Joseph wondered. His brothers turned on him. They wanted to kill him, but sold him into slavery instead.

So the teenaged Joseph was carried into a strange land with a strange people while his brothers told Jacob he had died. No one would even try to find him.

He found success as Potiphar's servant. He excelled to the point that Potiphar put him in charge of everything in his household. Then Potiphar's wife falsely accused him of attempted rape and Joseph was thrown in an Egyptian prison. Imagine how he felt. He was trying to do the right thing. Trying to follow God by acting with honor and decency toward his master's wife. Why would God allow this to happen.

Joseph continued to serve God faithfully, and while in prison he became so trusted that he was put in charge of the rest of the prisoners. He met two men who had served Pharaoh, but had 'gotten on his bad side.' He interpreted dreams for them and asked the cupbearer if he would speak to Pharaoh on his behalf when he was restored to service.

Though he promised, the cupbearer forgot and Joseph languished in prison for two more years. Why, God?

Ah, but when Pharaoh had dreams that needed an interpretation, the cupbearer remembered. Joseph was successful and was eventually put second in charge of all Egypt behind only Pharaoh himself. Joseph still must have wondered why God allowed him to be separated from his Father, mother and brothers. Surely he missed home! It was then, many years later, that Joseph's brothers came to Egypt for food. Thinking Joseph dead (though Joseph lived and looked like an Egyptian) they didn't even recognize him when they had to beg him for food for their families.

When the brothers finally learned this was their brother they sold into slavery, they were afraid, but Joseph reassured them. *As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today.*

(Genesis 50:20)

David was anointed to be king of Israel, but then Saul tried to kill him. Daniel was a faithful Jewish boy taken into exile by the Babylonians. He served a foreign king the rest of his life without being unfaithful to God, yet when he was set up and accused of breaking the king's edict, he was thrown into a lion's den.

Why would God let that happen? If you faithfully serve Christ, why would he let those kinds of things happen to you?

After years of loneliness, mistreatment, suffering and separation, Joseph finally got the answer for his question of 'why?' God rescued David and Daniel. But we may never find out our 'why' this side of heaven.

When we don't know the answer, we must fall back on what we do know. That is where we must walk by faith and not by sight. Pastor and evangelist Greg Laurie says this about the specific reasons we suffer. "I don't know. I just can't answer that. But I know this: God loves you. God is wiser than you. And 'all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose.'" (Romans 8:28)

Twelve men and many other disciples followed the man they thought was the Messiah, God's anointed one. He spoke as no one had ever spoken before. He did many miracles. He healed diseases and cast out demons. Yet one of the twelve betrayed him. His own people, with the help of the Roman government, crucified him.

Recipe Swap

STRAWBERRY ICEBOX CAKE

3 ½ c. whipped cream, divided
1 3.4 oz pkg. cheesecake pudding
2 c. milk
12 graham crackers
2 ½ c. fresh sliced strawberries

Optional toppings: graham cracker crumbs, chopped nuts, drizzle of chocolate, powdered sugar for dusting

In a large bowl, make the pudding according to package directions. Allow 5 minutes to thicken. Once thickened, fold in 3 cups of whipped cream. Spread a thin layer of the cream mixture in an 8x8 pan to coat the bottom. Place 3 graham crackers across the center of the pan and then break up 1 or 2 more crackers as needed to fill the space. Spread half of the cream mixture on top. Place a single layer of strawberries. Top with another layer of graham crackers, breaking them as needed to make them fit. Spread the remaining cream mixture over top. Add another layer of strawberries. Top with the final layer of graham crackers. Spread the reserved ½ cup of whipped cream over evenly. Place the last layer of berries over top. Put whatever optional topping you like on it. Refrigerate for at least 4 hours or overnight.

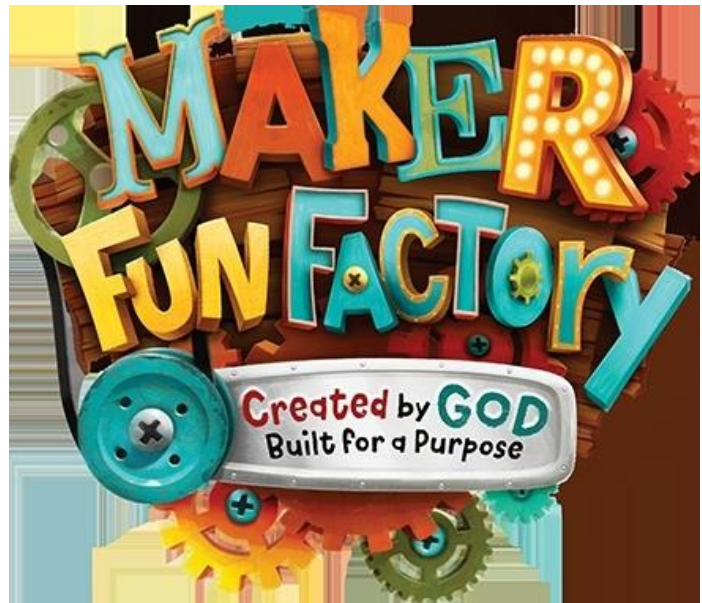

Though Jesus warned them many times, I am sure the apostles and women who followed Jesus wondered, ‘why God?’ Why would you let your Son be crucified? What good could come out of this?

That was Friday. On Sunday, the very first Resurrection Sunday, the risen Jesus could have uttered the same words as Joseph to the very ones who nailed him to that old rugged cross. *As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today.*

That is what Easter is all about. Jesus died a horrific death to pay for our sins. He rose from the dead to defeat death and offer eternal life to all who choose to believe in Him as their Lord and Savior. And to all who suffer in this world, He offers a world to come where suffering, sin and death are banished forever.

We can't see the end from the beginning, so let us put our trust in the One who does. Though He allows suffering, He is always with us through it. Though our lives seem so out of control, He is always in control. Though He will often allow us to go through circumstances that we can't handle, He will always be able to handle it for us. When our life seems to be at its worst, He knows what is best.

Our God who loves us enough to give His one and only Son to die our death will one day make all things new for us.

*The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, and provide for those who grieve in Zion-- to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor. **Isaiah 61:1-3 (NIV)***

This Resurrection season, as always, rejoice in our Lord who loves you, died for you, rose for you, and is always with you.
