Where Families Grow

I enjoy when I am able to bring a children's message during our worship service. I love it when I see many young people with an eagerness to come up front and listen to what this old guy has to say. Some of their responses to my questions are hilarious, and I am sure some parents wait in fearful anticipation of what their children might say.

There was recently a particularly memorable message for the kids where a very young child kept saying something, but I couldn't quite understand what it was. OK, I didn't even come close to understanding, but the child just kept on saying it. Other kids began to giggle, adults joined in and pretty soon laughter filled the sanctuary.

I'm not sure the kids got the message that week, but I believe there was another message sent. We love kids. We want kids – the more the merrier!

I love it when kids worship with their families. I know many times, moms and dads get distraught because their toddlers are being noisy, their preschoolers can't sit still, their pre-teens don't pay attention and their teens are asleep! Parents, this probably bothers you more than anyone else! I don't mind the sounds of children during church. [By the way, if the sounds DO bother you or make it so it is hard for you to hear, please, I invite you to sit in the first few rows so you are closer to the speakers!]

Worshiping together allows families to grow together. During the week, kids are at school while mom and dad are at work. Different kids with different activities often have parents separated in the evenings and weekends trying to meet all the obligations of these activities. Church is a time when the family can be together and unify around what should be the most important thing in their life – Jesus!

For those who think, "What's the use? My kids are so noisy (the parents 'shooshing' their kids are often louder than the kids!) I can't even hear half of what is

going on. So why put in the effort to go at all?

Here is why. You are instilling a habit in your children and family. You are sending the message to them that church is worth it. We are a family and we love Jesus and this is what we do. It is not up for debate or discussion. We are the parents and you are the child and the child does not dictate the agenda of this family. I have never understood the family that decides to go to church – or not go – based upon whether or not the children want to go that week.

You are teaching them that the Bible instructs corporate worship and our family follows the Bible. Prayerfully, you are setting an example they will take into their families when they are older.

Church allows you to teach your children respect for God. The noise of the little children is like music to my ears, but church is also a time to begin to teach quietness and respect and the ability to sit. Small doses at first, based upon your child's ability and personality, so that by the time they are teenagers and young adults they can get everything out of the worship experience that God wants them to.

Church gives you the opportunity to make mentoring relationships that can help you with your families (can anyone say M&Ms?). I love the intergenerational relationships within our church. Young people who will talk to those of any age and older people who are willing to get down on a knee and look a child in the eyes to speak with them.

Contrary to what many people say, children are not the church of the future. They are the church today. If we don't embrace them, teach them and love them, there won't be a church in the future! Come let your family grow with us! *"Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven."* **Matthew 19:14 (ESV)**

Recipe Swap

BAKED ZITI

2 T. olive oil
3 cloves garlic, minced
1 large onion, diced
1 pound ground beef
1 pound Italian sausage
Two 14.5 ounce tomato sauce or marinara sauce
28 ounce can whole tomatoes with juice
2 tsp. Italian seasoning
½ tsp. red pepper flakes
Salt and pepper
1 pound ziti
1 ½ pounds shredded mozzarella
15 ounces ricotta cheese
½ c. grated parmesan
2 T. chopped fresh parsley, plus more for sprinkling
2 eggs

Heat olive oil in a pot. Add onions, garlic, ground beef and sausage and cook until meat is browned. Drain off most of the fat. Add the tomato sauce, tomatoes, Italian seasoning, red pepper flakes, salt and pepper. Stir and simmer for 30 minutes. Remove 3-4 cups of the cooked sauce to a bowl to cool down. Cook your ziti until not quite al dente. Heat oven to 375*. In a bowl mix 2 cups of the mozzarella, the ricotta, parmesan, parsley, eggs, salt and pepper. Drain the pasta and rinse to cool down then add to the cheese mixture. Add the cooled reserved meat sauce and combine. Add half of the pasta mixture to a large casserole dish. Spoon half of the remaining sauce over the top, then top with half of the remaining mozzarella. Repeat with another layer of the coated pasta and the remaining sauce and mozzarella. Bake until bubbling, about 20 minutes. Let stand about 5 minutes before sprinkling with chopped parsley to serve. 12 servings

Mission Lake Camp Update

As many people are now aware, the city of Horton has challenged the lease of the MLCC grounds and declared the lease invalid. MLCC sits on city owned property, but signed a 99 year lease with the city in 1986.

The city claims that it does not want to close down the camp or keep kids from having camp, but that it is not fair that MLCC has sole use of the land and that it violates the establishment clause of the U.S. Constitution.

The city desires to take back control of most of the grounds while still allowing the camp to have access during camp times and allowing the camp to keep their buildings.

The board of MLCC sees this as a potential slippery slope that will see the camp's rights and use of the grounds slowly erode until there is no longer a camp there.

The camp now has an attorney allied with Alliance Defending Freedom who will help the camp challenge the city's claims. A copy of his letter to the city is available to read upon request. We will keep you updated of any new developments. Please continue to pray for MLCC and the board of directors.
